Eviction Prevention Rent Assistance

This rent assistance program is different than the pandemic relief rent assistance programs (ERAP and T-RAP) from the past few years. This program is permanently funded through state legislation.

Eviction Prevention Rent Assistance has limited funding. These programs are often at capacity and may not be taking new clients.

- EPRA has limited funding and will not be able to serve every eligible applicant. Availability may vary. The program is often at capacity and not accepting new applicants. New applicants may be put on a waitlist or the waitlist may be closed.
- EPRA has an applicant screening process to help serve the tenants most at risk for eviction and homelessness.
- Tenants accepted into the EPRA program are required to participate in housing stability planning with a case manager.
